















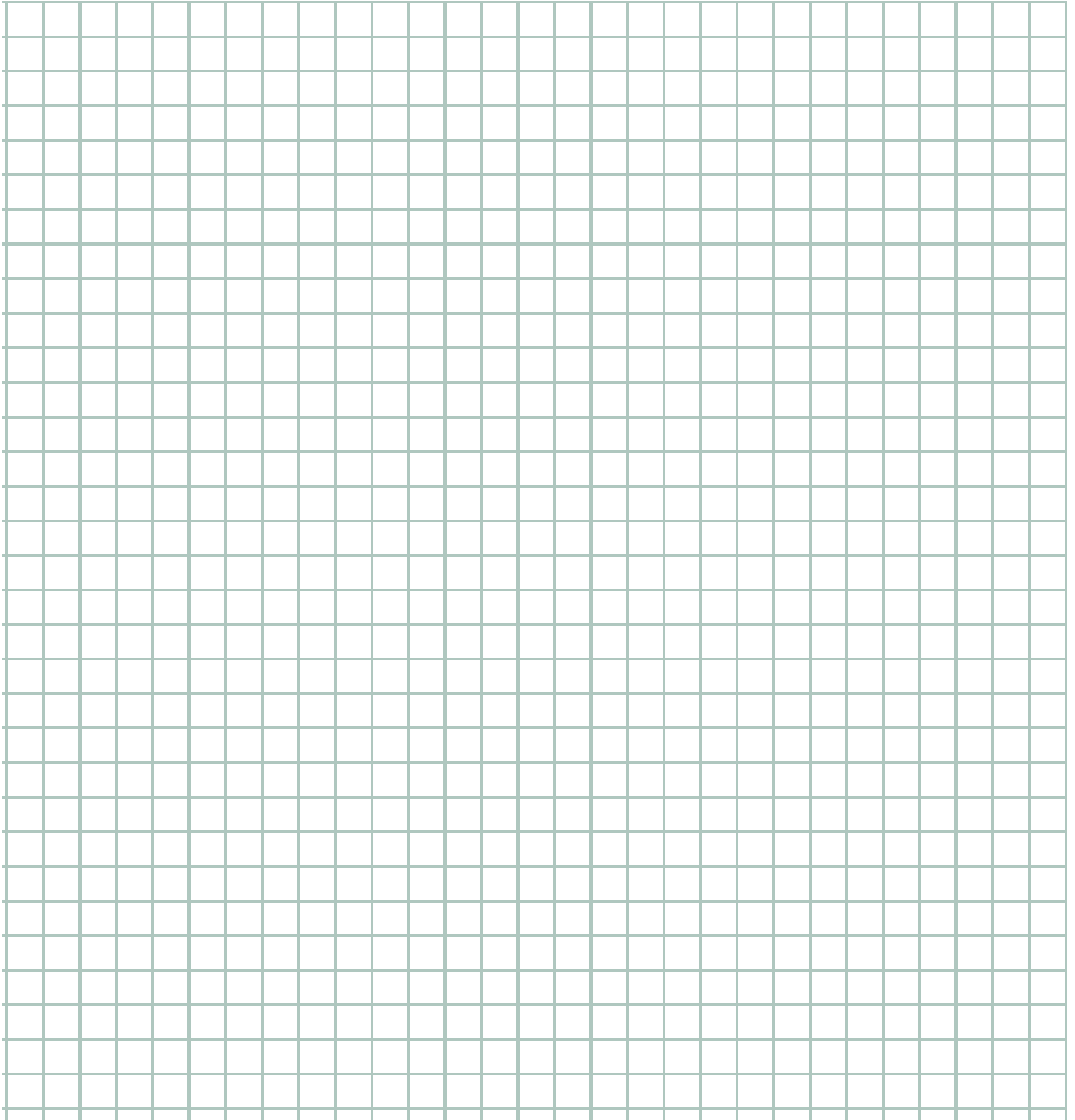


THE URBAN GAME

The Urban Game Online Instructions

1. Find a computer with internet access and Microsoft Office software.
